



AGA CENTOCOR EXCELLENCE IN IBD CLINICAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

DESCRIPTION

This award provides \$70,000 to enable promising senior GI fellows to spend an additional year upon completion of their training programs engaged full-time in clinical research related to inflammatory bowel disease.

OBJECTIVE

- To prepare physicians for independent research careers in inflammatory bowel diseases. The award provides salary support for additional full-time research training in clinical science to acquire modern laboratory skills. The additional year of research training provided by this award should broaden and expand the scope of investigative tools available to the recipient.
- The proposed project should address an important clinical question in such a way as to provide a meaningful answer.

ELIGIBILITY

- At the time of application, candidates are not allowed to hold or to have held R01, R21, R29, K-series award, Veterans Affairs Career Development Award or any award with similar objectives from non-federal sources (such as the American Liver Foundation, Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America, Robert Wood Johnson Foundation or Glaxo Institute of Digestive Health).
- These awards may not be renewed.
- **No more than one application will be accepted from any institution in a given year.**
- Candidates must hold an MD or equivalent degree (eg, MB, ChB, MBBS, DO), and should be currently enrolled in an accredited gastroenterology-related fellowship at a US institution, committed to academic careers.
- Please note that non-U.S. citizens based at U.S. institutions are eligible to apply.
- Women and minority investigators are strongly encouraged to apply.
- Applicants must be AGA Trainee Members and be sponsored by an AGA Member. (Please visit www.gastro.org for membership information.)

AWARD OVERLAP

If an award recipient receives notification of another award with overlapping scientific objectives, prior to the start date of an AGA or FDHN award, the applicant must choose between the two awards.

REQUIREMENTS

- Awards are made for salary support for the recipient. Indirect costs are not allowed. Funds should not be simply an addition to the sponsors' funds already being applied to very similar work, but should fund a new, innovative study or address a different aspect of a study being done by the mentor.
- No more than 10% should be spent on equipment, as the institution should already have any major items needed, or be willing to supply them.
- Applicants must devote a minimum of 75% time and effort to the project.
- Applicants must submit a cover letter (not more than two pages) describing their career goals and how the award will specifically help in their attainment. Applicants must also submit a 250-word abstract, including the potential significance of the work to the field of inflammatory bowel disease.
- Applicants must demonstrate how they will obtain additional knowledge through the proposed project and how that knowledge may be used in their future research.
- Three letters of recommendation from (1) the GI/departmental section head, (2) the present or previous research preceptor/director, and (3) the department chair must be submitted.
- A clear timeline for completion of the one-year study, or indication of how it will be completed after the one year of funding, must be provided.



- Upon notification of receipt of this award, awardee must provide approval from the appropriate committee at your institution for use of human subjects or animals. If approval is not necessary, awardee must provide explanation.
- A complete financial statement and scientific progress report are required upon completion of the program. The recipient will be required to indicate how the funds were used, the accomplishments made during the project and how the additional training contributed to his/her research career development.
- All publications arising from work funded by this program must acknowledge support from Centocor, the AGA and the AGA Foundation for Digestive Health and Nutrition.

SPONSORS

- Applicants must be sponsored by an AGA member (please visit www.gastro.org for membership information) who is a member of an academic gastroenterology-related unit engaged in research training in a U.S. or Canadian medical school, affiliated teaching hospital or research institute. The sponsor must ensure that all institutional requirements have been met regarding application for and receipt of research funds and must clearly state that the work submitted by the applicant is that of the applicant and not the sponsor. It is expected that the aims of the application should be distinct from those of the sponsor's research program. Should the experimental objectives of other applications from the sponsor be included in the application for the Centocor award, the applicant will be disqualified from consideration.
- Each applicant must be co-sponsored by the director of a clinical or other comparable laboratory, who is committed to the training and development of the recipient, prepared to offer the resources of his/her laboratory, and able to spend the requisite time and effort necessary to guarantee a high-quality research and training experience. The co-sponsor must have recognized credentials relevant to the general area of the proposal in order to provide appropriate mentoring. The co-sponsor's biosketch and summary of grant support must also be provided.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Recipients will be selected based on novelty, feasibility and significance of the proposal; attributes of the candidate; the record and commitment of the sponsors; and the institutional and laboratory environment.

REVIEW PROCESS

A selection committee comprised of members of the AGA Research Committee will review the proposals and select the recipients in March.

DEADLINE

The deadline for receipt of applications without exception is **January 14**. An electronic copy of the application must be submitted by the deadline to awards@fdhn.org. If the deadline falls on a weekend, applications must be received by midnight the following Monday. Letters of Commitment may be e-mailed by the signatories or mailed to the Foundation for Digestive Health and Nutrition, 4930 Del Ray Avenue, Bethesda, MD 20814, postmarked by the deadline.
